



Reykjanes Tour

Today we will go on a tour where you will catch a glimpse of a little bit of everything Iceland has to offer; two geothermal sites, dramatic coastlines and quaint, historic towns.

Departing from Reykjavik and set our journey to the Reykjanes Peninsula, filled with sights not seen anywhere else! Start by going back centuries and take a look at the Viking world and get to know more about the settlement of Iceland and see the replica of a Viking ship located in Keflavik. Our next stop is at the stone built church of Hvalneskirkja, built in 1887. Pass through the lavafields of Reykjanes peninsula on our way to the Bridge between the continents – a fissure that provides clear evidence of the rift between the Eurasian and the American tectonic plates. Visit the Reykjanesviti lighthouse, Gunnhver hot spring and geothermal area as well as Brimketill - a lavarock formation which is shaped like a pool. A stop at Krísuvík hot spring area is planned where you walk among hissing steam vents, solfataras and bubbling mud pots. Our final stop of the day is at Kleifarvatn lake which is set within a volcanic fissure, a 100 meters deep and said to be the home to a strange, mythical creature. The lake is eerie and surrounded by a jet black lava cape, black cliffs and black sand shores – some say it feels like being on the moon...
